- Take on leading roles in whole school masses
- Plan and organise charitable events to fundraise for our local and wider community
- Support in the selection of Caritas Award winners



School Chaplains need to be committed as this role involves

- Weekly meetings with the Chaplaincy Team
- Preparation of prayer sessions
- Looking out for people who need help in school
- Occasionally attending school and church events in your own time



This means that you must be prepared to give up your play on a MONDAY lunchtime to attend meetings and also another lunchtime to deliver prayer sessions.

If you do not want to give up any of your free time over the whole school year then please do not apply. This is a big commitment.
